FALL YARD PREPARE

Prepping your yard in Phoenix for the fall and winter requires a unique approach due to the desert climate. Here are the top 10 ways to get your yard ready for the cooler season:

- Overseed Your Lawn: Plant winter ryegrass to maintain a green lawn during the cooler months. October is the best time for overseeding.
- 2. Adjust Watering Schedule: As temperatures drop, reduce the frequency of irrigation for both grass and desert plants. Focus on deep, less frequent watering to encourage strong root growth.
- 3. **Fertilize the Lawn**: Apply a balanced fertilizer to help your winter grass establish itself. Use a slow-release option to ensure steady growth.
- 4. **Trim Trees and Shrubs**: Prune trees and shrubs to remove dead or damaged branches, improving overall plant health and minimizing winter damage.
- 5. **Rake and Clean Up**: Remove fallen leaves, branches, and debris to prevent pests and ensure proper airflow around your plants.
- 6. Protect Tender Plants: Cover frost-sensitive plants with burlap or frost cloth when temperatures dip, especially tropical or young plants vulnerable to sudden temperature drops.
- 7. **Mulch Flower Beds**: Add a layer of mulch around flower beds and plants to help regulate soil temperature and conserve moisture
- 8. **Plant Cool-Season Vegetables**: Take advantage of Phoenix's mild winter to plant vegetables like lettuce, kale, broccoli, and carrots for a productive winter garden.



9. Aerate the Soil: Aerate compacted areas of your lawn to improve nutrient absorption and oxygen flow. This helps winter grass establish strong roots.

10. Clean and Store Garden Tools: Wash, sharpen, and store garden tools properly for winter. Well-maintained tools are ready for the next gardening season.

DID YOU KNOW???

In the late 1800s the area that is now Glendale was all desert. **William John Murphy**, a native of New Hartford, New York, who resided in the town of Flagstaff in what was then the territory of Arizona, was in charge of building the 40-mile-long Arizona Canal from Granite Reef to New River for the **Arizona Canal Company**.

In 1885, he completed the canal, which would bring water to the desert land. Murphy was deep in debt, since he had agreed to be paid in Arizona Canal Company stock and bonds and land instead of cash.

In 1887, Murphy formed the **Arizona**Improvement Company. His objective was to sell the land and water rights south of the canal. Murphy raised capital from out of state sources in order to meet payroll and construction expenses.

Murphy decided to refer to this land as "Glendale".

In order to develop and interest potential investors and settlers in this new town, Murphy decided to provide a better way of access from **Phoenix** to **Glendale** and ending in the town of **Peoria** by building an 18-mile-long diagonal road which he named **Grand Avenue.**
